### **Dear Parents and Carers**

It is hard to believe that we are almost at the end of the first part of the spring term. However the mornings and the evening are getting lighter, and not only are the first snowdrops appearing, but I have seen a few early daffodils too!

#### **Sports' Relief**

I have been absolutely amazed and humbled by the generosity and kindness of our children this week. Our Sports' relief challenge was only launched this week by Mrs Churchill and so many children have emptied their own money boxes of coppers and put the money in the red buckets in Reception. The ladies in the office have been very busy counting them and so far we have about  $\pounds_{30}$ . We have quite a way to go to reach our target-please feel free to contribute other coins too.

#### **Swimming Lessons**

It has been brought to my attention that a number of children are trying to opt out of swimming lessons, which not only form part of the National Curriculum, but also teach the children a vital life skill. The curriculum states that by the end of KS2 all children should be able to swim a minimum distance of 25 metres unaided. It is therefore essential that your child participates in all swimming offered, in the same way that they have to take part in other lessons, so that they reach the required standard.

## **School Buses**

Although we have not officially been notified, we understand that from 7<sup>th</sup> of March the coach transport to and from school will no longer be Grayline but instead a company called Walters. A few parents have raised concerns about this change. The contract for school transport is arranged entirely by Oxfordshire County Council. The contract has gone out to tender and the County has chosen Walters presumably on the basis of price. Our school has had no consultation in this decision. #### Uniform

There are an increasing number of children coming to school in trainers because "my shoes are broken". I counted three on Monday and two more since then. Please try and ensure your child's school shoes follow our uniform policy, and if for any reason they do have to wear an alternative make those shoes as discreet as possible ie: black. Many thanks for your support.

#### **Musical Box**

I have been visited this week by Tim Kirkham, the Studio Director from the Musical Box, who offers extracurricular music lessons to our pupils. Unfortunately, due to the low number of children taking lessons, the Musical Box might have to withdraw from our school. This would be a real shame as there are very few schools that offer contemporary music tuition of this standard. Please look out for a letter from the Musical Box in the children's book bags tonight (Years 2-6) and a registration document. Lessons cost  $\epsilon_{19}$  for half an hour, which might seem a lot for lessons during school time, but it is 1:1 tuition, is comparable to lessons taking place outside of school hours and the students make rapid progress. Tim is offering trial lessons at the moment, so you can pay for one lesson and let your child try the instrument first. If you want your child to learn a new instrument please complete the registration form and return it returned to school by next Friday, so that Tim can judge whether he will be able to continue to offer his services.

We are very grateful for their participation and they make a difference to all of our children.
