Dear Parents and Carers

The children have settled well into their new classes and are working hard-it's as if they've never been away! Over the next few weeks after school clubs and extra-curricular activities will be arranged, so please look out for e-mails with the details of them.

You will already have received a flyer from Musical Box, who teach more contemporary music in school. We are really lucky as we are the only school the company comes to, but unfortunately, they have informed us that unless they get more students (now that last year's very musical Year 6s have moved on) they won't be able to continue.

Health and Safety

Just a reminder that we ask you **not** to take your children into the cloakrooms in the morning, mainly for health and safety reasons-there just isn't room for adults and children in the small spaces and children can very easily be hurt on the cloakroom pegs if they end up being squashed against them. It also helps develop the children's independence and organisational skills if they are encouraged to bring their own belongings into school, say "Goodbye" at the door and deal with their own coat, book bag and lunch box.

Free School Meals

Can I remind you that if your child is in EYFS or Key Stage 1 they are entitled to a free school meal? However, if you receive any financial help from the government e.g. housing benefit, whichever class your child is in, please let us know, as we can get extra money to support their education (even if you don't take up the free school meal).

Attendance

Thank you so much for your support last year, where attendance is concerned. We had a whole school attendance figure of 97.15% over the year and an unauthorised absence figure of 0.46%, which is fantastic. Obviously, we can always do better, so please can I remind you that we are able to administer **prescribed medicines** in school and that research has shown that low attendance does affect a child's progress. It is part of my role to monitor attendance and lateness weekly and to report persistent absence and lateness to the County Welfare Officer. Lessons begin at 8:50am and classes are always set a morning activity, so latecomers are missing out on vital learning.

Volunteer Readers

We are looking for a few more volunteer readers for the coming year. If you are interested in coming into school every week to hear children read, please let me know. It benefits our children greatly!

Documents

In the next week you will be receiving a series of documents from the School Office, which we have to send annually. I would ask you to return the completed forms as soon as possible, so that Mrs Yeomans can complete our records. If you have any problems printing any of the forms, please let us know. Thank you for your help.
