## Message from the Head

Another busy week has flown by, with golf enrichment days led by our Premier coaches at the start, a Remembrance Day service, and collections for Children in Need.

The children demonstrated great respect in the playground on Wednesday morning as we held our short tribute to all the soldiers lost in the wars. We listened to a verse from Laurence Binyon's poem 'For the Fallen', heard the Last Post played over speakers, and held a two minute silence. The classes have all been writing remembrance poems and creating poppy pictures and crafts, which are on magnificent display in the school.

As you are aware, we are working extremely hard in school to address the loss of learning time which all children have experienced during the Covid pandemic. Our pupil progress meetings, where I meet with staff to assess development, have gone well but show that practice of basic skills needs more work.
Obviously we teach children reading skills in school but daily reading at home is absolutely vital to ensure that they have consistency and achieve reading levels fully. Work on times tables is also something parents and carers can help children perfect. Automatic recall, so that they have the skills for their mathematic tasks, will make a huge difference and accelerate progress.

I do know how hard it is to fit these tasks into busy family life but I also know we are blessed with parents and carers who really want the best for their children. Just two or three times a week would make all the difference. Practising times tables as you journey in the car or are laying the table etc will bring an element of fun to these essential accomplishments, alongside the use of Times Table Rockstars. Thank you.

This week the Sharks have used their experience of reading WW1 poems to write their own Remembrance poems, showing what they have learnt about the experience of soldiers during the war, and using lots of figurative language like similes, metaphors, personification, alliteration and onomatopoeia. Everyone has produced some very powerful and moving poems, which we look forward to presenting next week so we can create a display along with our WW1 silhouette artwork. Sharks have also enjoyed working through the Children in Need 'Five to Thrive' activities this week, learning some great strategies for boosting physical and mental wellbeing.
