Message from Mr Hart

This week I have been working with Advisory staff on aspects brought up in our Ofsted inspection, all of which will create improvements for our children.

I have also attended a Leadership Conference where the focus for Headteachers was on values-based schooling and curriculum design.

I was really pleased to monitor 'behaviour for learning' within our classroom and beyond during the week. Our pupils were engaged and enjoying what they were being taught which is always good to see. This was a very positive aspect noted during the inspection and continues to be a strength of our school.

One part of curriculum development that we need to work on is investigation, reasoning and problem solving in Mathematics and this is going to be a focus over the coming term. I think that this will be very challenging and enjoyable for our pupils and we will be collating evidence of the skills that the children acquire during their learning.

We have finally reached the end of the first half of the Summer term and are looking forward to a good break, ready for the last six weeks of this academic year. The second half of the term is full of activity so we hope that all the children will be rested and ready to tackle some hard work and fun!

Class Activities

Tiddlers & Minnows

The Tiddlers and Minnows have had a joyful end to this half term.

In music they have continued to listen and appraise funk music and are learning to sing a song 'Big Bear Funk'. They have continued learning facts about snails and the Minnows used their excellent Phonic skills to write these facts in their English books.



In Maths the Minnows have been learning about subtraction - they can use objects to find the answer to some number sums - and the Tiddlers have been using balancing scales to discover how heavy and light objects around the classroom are.

The children also had a great time in Forest School where they played some of their favourite Forest School games, snakes vs lions vs eagles and 1, 2, 3, where are you? A fantastic way to end this half term!

Sticklebacks

During the week the Sticklebacks talked about the story book 'Dogger' and then discussed the emotion of losing things.



They have started some work on fractions and finding halves of shapes. The children went around the school grounds and drew lines to show halves on objects.

Well done to the whole class for such confident performances in their class sharing worship yesterday! Mrs Ejiogu was very proud of everyone.



Seahorses

This week the Seahorses have shown amazing *personal* success in their writing, as they have written some fantastic diary entries as a character from their book 'Couch Potato'. They have also used their editing stations to help them proof read their work so that they can learn from their mistakes and continue to grow as authors.

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In maths the Year 3s have been finding fractions of amounts which has really tested their reasoning skills. Meanwhile, the Year 2s have been exploring shapes and using what they have learnt to develop their problem solving skills.



In PE this week the children have looked at agility as they have been racing to different sides of the muga.

Stingrays

All the school values were shown by the children on Monday when they worked together to create 'a den with a theme' in Forest School. Mr Pemble, Mrs Churchill and Mrs Neal (PE & Well Being governor) were very impressed with their creativity, enjoying the challenge of guessing the themes which ranged from a cinema to a tea room!

In Maths the children have continued to develop their understanding of decimals, showing increased confidence in working with decimals to two decimal places.

'Endurance' was definitely required on Tuesday when the classroom was transformed into a 'clay workshop'. Dali would certainly be pleased to see the impact his work has had on the children as they allowed their imaginations to run free to create their models.

It was also great to see such 'Confidence and Self-Belief' and 'Respect and Compassion' when the children auditioned for their upcoming production. Both actors and audience were brilliant.

During English they had a very enthusiastic debate about whether we should keep zoos or not. The children showed great respect and passion for their viewpoints and were able to back up their arguments using research and knowledge.

In Geography they watched the volcanic eruption in Iceland during 2010. The class was fascinated with the moving dust cloud and thought of the effects this would have on the local, national and international communities. They are very much enjoying this topic.

Sharks

Sharks have been developing their journalistic writing this week, writing news reports about a miraculous mountain rescue. To help them practise using direct and reported speech to give quotes, they enjoyed a drama lesson using the adventure trail as the Swiss Alps so they could act out some of the events they were reporting on and collect quotes from the characters involved.



Sharks (continued)

In Maths they have been practising a range of strategies to mentally multiply larger numbers, as well as developing rounding and inverse strategies which mean they can check the accuracy of their own calculations when problem solving.

Wednesday was an exciting day when Sharks and Stingrays auditioned for roles in their upcoming performance of Shakespeare Rocks. The teachers were impressed with the **Confidence, Self-Belief and Endurance** of all of the performers, and hope that they enjoy reading through their lines over half term ahead of them starting rehearsals soon.
