#### Message from Mr Hart

A busy and productive week in school sees our staff and children settling into new routines and expectations.

It has been lovely to see parents back on site and have more freedom to interact fully as we believe the link between home and school is so vital.

We have been refining our timetabling this week to make the most of all our staff expertise. I am pleased to report that **Stingrays** and **Sharks** will have smaller group key skills sessions for up to 4 mornings each week, ensuring that work can be targeted effectively for these classes. It means that children will be working in groups of approximately 15 for Maths and Literacy teaching; an enviable ratio compared to most schools. When these groups come together as a whole class, with a teacher and two teaching assistants, the ratio of adult to child is 1:11, again creating effective staff support to help pupils maximise their learning and progress.

A huge thank you to those children who entered my summer challenge which closed today. I will be judging the entries and prizes will follow next week.

#### Attendance

It is wonderful that many restrictions have been lifted but we do still have to remain vigilant regarding signs and symptoms of Covid. If you do notice any signs that lead you to believe your child may have Covid we request that, in line with PHE and Government guidance, you immediately seek a PCR test. It is important that this is not a lateral flow test as these are not valid to be used on children aged 11 and under. Please also note that, whilst self-isolation is no longer required if you are double vaccinated or under 18, everyone in the household is expected to take a PCR test as well. As a school we would appreciate knowing this information as soon as possible.

#### **Class Activities**

The *Tiddlers* and *Minnows* have settled into the routine of school very well! They have really enjoyed exploring their classroom and completing fun activities. This week they have started their topic, All about Me; they have looked at the differences and similarities between them and their friends and created self-portraits which have been put up on display.

They also enjoyed their first Forest School lesson with Mr Pemble, playing a very exciting game of Lions, Snakes and Eagles

and starting to investigate some natural objects.





Today was extra exciting for them all as they had their first PE lesson and attended their first whole school Worship. It has been a brilliant week!

The *Sticklebacks* have also settled in to their new class really well. They have started their Great Fire of London topic by finding out where London is and identifying some famous London landmarks and they really enjoyed their first Forest School session.

This week the *Seahorses* have been writing non-chronological reports about themselves as well as exploring place value in Maths. They have also investigated some of the inventions from Ancient Sumer and the beliefs in Ancient Egypt as part of their look into Early Civilisations.

*Stingrays* have made a very positive start to the new term. They are already showing great independent skills, coming into class in the morning and focusing quickly on their First Thing tasks. Using the picture book 'The River', they have written some great descriptive sentences revising how they can quickly change a simple sentence into a much more interesting complex or compound sentence. It was also great to see them working so well in the team building and problem-solving activities they did in PE this week - it proved to be an enjoyable way to get to know each other.

They have made a great start in their Science topic with a debate about whether sand is a liquid, and have produced some fantastic French number work.



*Sharks* have had a great week settling back into school, adapting quickly to their new routines and class contract rules, and showing a positive learning attitude.

In English lessons they have enjoyed reading some of Rudyard Kipling's Just So Stories, thinking about how to use the context of a sentence to work out the meaning of tricky vocabulary; they have also been reading aloud with expression, as different groups practised different stories which they then shared with their friends in small groups.

The children have also impressed Sharks staff with their work in Maths, showing a great understanding of place value in large numbers. The children were excited to beat the adults in our first round of 'the hats game!'
