Class Activities

Tiddlers & Minnows

The Tiddlers and Minnows have really enjoyed starting their new topic, Heroes, this week. They started this topic by reading a class favourite 'Supertato'; they knew just from the front cover that Supertato was the hero in the story. The children have discussed what characteristics a hero has and know that heroes aren't just superheroes in books and TV shows but there can be real life heroes too.



The Minnows wrote a super sentence about who their hero is and why that person is their hero. In Maths, the Tiddlers have continued working hard on counting actions and verbally counting up to 10, and the Minnows have enjoyed learning about odd and even numbers. They were very good at spotting the pattern of even numbers being in between odd numbers. Another busy week in Early Years!

Sticklebacks

The Sticklebacks have had a very sporty week learning table tennis, hand ball, and even football with Mr Bradley! They all enjoyed the different exercises and showed great *Confidence*, *Self-Belief and Endurance* as they tried the new activities.

During the week the children spent some time learning about the five K's in Sikhism, what they signify and how they show their devotion to the religion.





Seahorses

This week the Seahorses have been reflecting on how they have grown and learned this year and how they want their 'seeds' to continue to grow next year. They have made some beautiful artwork based on the Parable of the Sower and they have discussed the meaning of the different types of soil.

In science the children have been investigating food chains and have relished the opportunity to use new scientific vocabulary like 'tertiary consumer'.



In maths the Year 2s have been investigating lengths and learning how to use bit metres and centimetres, whereas the year 3s have been exploring grams and kilograms.

Stingrays

This week Stingrays have been working hard on their performance of "Shakespeare Rocks" and, as you can see from the photos, are really looking forward to performing for you next week.





In between rehearsals, they continued to embrace opportunities to try out new sports. This week it was handball and the warmup drill certainly required a lot concentration and teamwork to achieve 'Personal Success' for everyone.



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They have also been looking at time in Maths this week and using their problem-solving skills to remind them of all the different number facts they need to know to be able to tell the time accurately. Some pupils were even inspired to spend their break time working out how many seconds there are in a year!

The children also started work on their news reports about Tsunamis - there were definitely some '*Inspired Minds*' as they thought about the vocabulary they could use in their writing.

Sharks

What an exciting week of transition! As well as our school move-up morning on Wednesday, where the new Sharks Class planned how they were going to *grow and learn together with God* next year, lots of the Year 6 children have been on transition visits to their new secondary schools as well. Their English lessons this week have also tied in with their growing and learning focus, studying Jason Reynolds' poem *For Everyone* which is all about never giving up on your dreams.
