## Pupil Premium Statement of allocation 2018-2019

"The Government believes that the Pupil Premium, which is additional to main school funding, is the best way to address the current underlying inequalities between children eligible for free school meals (FSM) and their wealthier peers by ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils it needs most." (DfE website 26th April 2012)

In 2018-2019 Fritwell CE Primary School was allocated £11,160 for pupils entitled to the pupil premium. This is used in order to ensure that inequalities are addressed.

The money is being spent on the following:

## Impact of actions 2017-2018

We had 1 Disadvantaged Child who left us in July 2018 who reached the expected level in all areas and greater depth in writing and reading.

We had 4 other Disadvantaged Children in total in the school, all of whom made at least good progress towards their end of year targets.

The school keeps detailed tracking of all children including tracking for Pupil Premium children. The Headteacher reports to governors on the progress of individual cohorts and the governors monitor the impact of the spending of pupil premium money.
