After School Care

It has been brought to my attention that some of you are wondering whether after school care will continue, in light of Mrs Mooney's pregnancy. Swimming Coach

Please can I remind you that we now have to ask for voluntary contributions towards the cost of transporting the children to their swimming lessons. This is in line with other primary schools nationally and a decision our governors reached last year due to our ever reducing budget. It costs the school over £3000 per year to fund the coach and we have been very lucky that in the past we have been able to take this from school funds. Thank you for your support with this.

Trips and Visits

You may recall that our governors also decided that if we did not receive enough voluntary contributions towards educational trips and visits, we would have to cancel them. Again, we are very fortunate that FoFS have paid towards some trips for the past couple of years, when funds allow. I'm afraid that we are now at the stage where we will have to carry out the governors' instructions if insufficient contributions are received by the deadline date indicated on letters. I do understand that the contributions are voluntary, but this has been the case in schools for at least 25 years. We want our children to continue to have exciting opportunities, which enhance their learning and have not taken this decision lightly, however school funds can no longer subsidise school trips.
