Stingrays have been busy being creative this week. They have all produced some fantastic moonscapes inspired by the work of Alan Bean - the astronaut who painted the moon. They used various collage techniques to create an effective background and then added a pastel sketch of an astronaut or moon buggy. All the children have also shared their homework projects. It has been lovely to see how confidently they shared their work with the rest of the class, listened respectfully to eachother, and then asked and answered some very challenging questions.



This week, as well as doing a great job of their assessments, *Sharks* have also been creating art that is 'out of this world!' Everyone has used marbling to create a swirly blue and green image to represent the Earth, and has also designed their own piece of space art, inspired by the work of astronaut-turned-artist Alan Bean.
