

On Wednesday 14th July we shall be having a 'Move up' day during which children will be meeting staff from their new classroom. On that day each child will then take home a letter from his/her 'new' teacher. I know that all staff are looking forward to meeting their new class and preparing a full and positive year ahead.

Despite the latest easing of Government regulations we will be retaining our procedures until the end of the term and we thank parents for their support in this.

Next Friday your child's school report will be taken home. Any child living between two different households will take home two reports, addressed to mother and father respectively. You will then need to make sure that one is given to the other parent.

Class Activities

The *Tiddlers* and *Minnows* have had a brilliant week at school. Their week began with the Minnows completing their PE enrichment; they did a fantastic job practising their throwing and jumping skills. They really worked hard on their long jump. They have also been learning about sea pollution as part of their Under the Sea Topic. After reading the story 'Somebody Swallowed Stanley' and watching some Blue Planet video clips, the children understood the danger of sea pollution and were able to discuss various ways we can keep our oceans clean and safe for the sea creatures. The Minnows were then able to create some amazing posters which remind people to put their rubbish in the bin and to look after sea animals. In Maths, the Minnows have been recapping their 3D shapes and the Tiddlers have continued their work on recognising and counting numbers to 10.





This week *Sticklebacks* enjoyed creating natural pieces of art work, inspired by the artist Andy Goldsworthy. In English, they have been writing stories based on 'One Tiny Turtle' and have been working hard to remember to use capital letters and full stops.

They have started their final RE unit where they will be finding out all about the Hajj to Makkah.

Seahorses have been evaluating the quesadillas they made last week, as well as developing their athletic skills. They have also been looking at the grasslands biome by exploring different areas of Kenya. Thanks to the donated money from FOFS they have started their 'secret garden experience; they are loving hearing the story being read to them and have enjoyed making Robins out of paper.



Using a photo of an athlete and their memories of Sports' Day *Stingrays* produced some excellent writing entitled 'Out of the Blocks'. They all worked really hard to choose powerful vocabulary to convey the emotions of the athlete at different stages of the race. Fractions has been their focus in Maths, which has meant that they have had to show real resilience to improve their skills and knowledge. In Science and PHSE they continue to look at reproduction in both humans and animals. Please check out the class page for some helpful videos. Thank you to everyone who has sent in their Summer homework. We will be sharing these in class next week, so if you haven't managed to send in their work there is still time.

Sharks have enjoyed getting in touch with nature this week! Tuesday was their first Forest School session, where they loved playing Lions, Eagles and Snakes and then creating natural pictures in the outdoor area. This work with Mr Pemble then inspired their approach towards our whole school Andy Goldsworthy natural art project, where all of the groups showed great Community, Citizenship and Service working within their teams.

In Maths, Sharks have been practising telling the time, reading timetables and converting between different units of time. They have also learnt how to calculate the mean, and used this skill to compare statistics about the English and Italian football squads ahead of Sunday's final: Italy's squad may be slightly older and more experienced, but we were reassured to see that England's forwards had a much higher goal-scoring average!
