





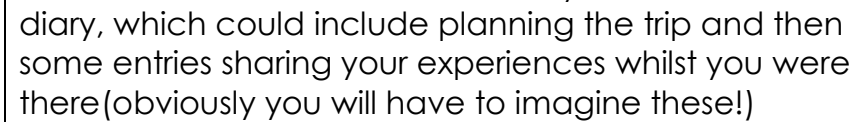
Romp through the Rainforest

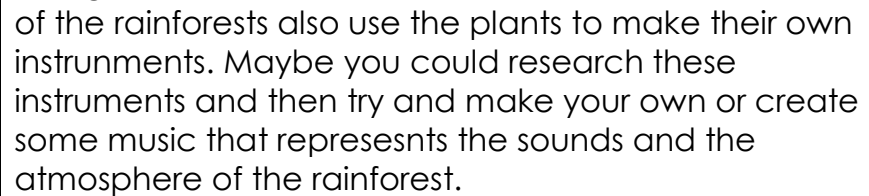
