Below is a selection of activities for you to complete over the next few weeks. You can present these activities however you like; on a big sheet of paper, in a folder, as a PowerPoint, in a book - be as creative as you like. **Unfortunately, at the moment, you will however only be able to submit a photo or share your work electronically due to the current restrictions.** It would be great if you can complete at least 3 of the activities. Enjoy! ☺

<u>Grow a plant</u> At home, have a go at growing a plant. How are you making sure that the plant has enough water, warmth, and sunlight? Can you measure the plant regularly to track how tall it is growing?	<u>Create your own animation</u> Have a go at creating your own animation. This could be like a flip book or a stop motion animation. You might want to have a go at using PowerPoint to create an animation like we have been doing in class.
<u>Research a rainforest animal</u> Chose an animal that lives in a rainforest biome; you might want to find out what it eats, what its habitat is like and how it survives. You can try and draw the creature or make even make a model of your animal.	<u>Make a plant</u> Can you have a go at making your own model of a plant? See if you can include a label the key parts of a plant and explain what their jobs are. Could you include information on what the plant needs to survive?
<u>Local life</u> With a grown up, take a walk around your local area. See if you can identify some of the trees, plants or animals that are in your local area. You might want to keep some of the leaves you find on your walk to help you identify the tree later on.	<u>A musical interview</u> Interview a grown up about the styles of music that they listened to when they were younger. What were some of the biggest artists, songs or popular genres of music when they were younger? Do you know anyone who likes disco music?
