I have had a wonderful week in a beautiful part of Wales with our
Year 5 and 6 students on their Kilvrough residential. Despite the
forecast the weather has been amazing and the activities have been
thoroughly enjoyed by all. I hope that the children will keep some very special memories of this time.



My thanks must go to the rest of the staff team who have worked so hard and have been an invaluable presence throughout the trip.

Class Activities

Despite the absence of a lot of children and several staff members the week has been just as busy.....

This week the *Tiddlers* and *Minnows* have mostly been learning about how our families are all different. They began the week by reading 'The Family Book' and discussing all the different families that were seen in the story. They then discussed their own families and their favourite things to do with their family. The children then created their own Family Portraits which are on display in the classroom.

The Tiddlers and Minnows also enjoyed another amazing Forest School lesson; this week the children had to work together to gather natural objects which they used to create a picture of Mr Pemble!

Finally, they ended their week by all coming to school in their yellow outfits for Hello Yellow day. Today they spoke about ways to stay happy and how to help people who are feeling sad, and they also took part in some Laughing Yoga which brought them all a lot of joy.

During week the *Sticklebacks* have been thinking about what the houses were like in London during the Great Fire and why they burned so quickly. They have started to make their own houses out of cereal boxes.

Their Circle Time session focused on managing their anger and they talked about the fact that it's okay to feel angry but not okay to hurt themselves, other people or belongings. Today they have written their own fairy tales or sequenced a fairy tale that they know well.

Seahorses have been using a variety of artistic skills to create different pieces of art work. They have used pointillism to create volcanoes linked to their science work on different types of rocks; they have also used collage and drawings to create their own versions of art work by Romare Bearden.





The children have also been working on descriptive language to describe what it would be like to live in a cave in the stone age, ready to write a narrative next week.

Stingrays have spent a week being just Year 4 and they have really been a pleasure to teach. They have worked hard consolidating all the maths they have learnt and really enjoyed learning more about Roman Numerals and reading thermometers.


They also used their work on water to write down Haiku's. These were truly fantastic and they have presented them really beautifully for their display.
