The Iffley Academy has applied to the Department for Education to open a new Free Special School in North Oxfordshire for pupils who have complex Special Educational Needs, including Autistic Spectrum Condition, Social, Emotional and Mental Health difficulties, and/or Cognition and Learning difficulties. The school would also offer places to students with Moderate Cognition and Learning needs. If the application is successful, the new school will further extend the current excellent special school provision in Bicester and Banbury.
