## Message from Mr Hart

Prior to half term I did a 'behaviour walk' around school to monitor learning behaviours within the classrooms. Good behaviour is obviously a sound principle for children to learn and we pride ourselves highly on our good manners and appropriate behaviour within the school.

Overall conduct is good, however some areas, including transition and movement around school, are points which will be our focus over the coming weeks. This will be shared with our pupils as a whole school challenge for improvement.

We are always pleased to hear of examples from out of school. Many thanks for your continued support.

I must also thank everyone who 'attended' their parent/teacher meetings this week. We do realise that, as always!, there were a couple of technical issues but fortunately these were few and were resolved quickly. I must thank my staff for their time and for the smooth running of their sessions.

#### **Class Activities**

## **Tiddlers & Minnows**



The Tiddlers and Minnows have had a rather busy and exciting week back at school. They have mostly been learning about Bonfire Night and why we celebrate it. They have watched videos of fireworks and bonfires and discussed various ways to stay safe during Bonfire Night celebrations; Fireman Sam had many safety tips to share with them.

#### Class Activities (continued)

In Maths, the Minnows have started to explore different ways of representing numbers to 5 and are ready to learn about the composition of these numbers next week. The Tiddlers have been learning all about the number 1 and are able to recognise and represent this number in various ways.

In PE, they have started to develop their ball skills by rolling footballs across the hall to a partner.

#### Sticklebacks

This week the children have learnt how to bounce a ball with their hands in PE and they have been improvising in music when playing the glockenspiels.

In Maths they have been finding fact families and writing addition number sentences. Their English work has focused on the text 'You're Snug with Me' and they've written sentences about the polar bears from the story.

#### Seahorses

During this week the year 2s have been doing column addition of 2-digit numbers while the year 3 children have been exchanging when doing column addition and subtraction of 2-digit numbers.

The class has been investigating stonehenge and been debating why stonehenge was built, as well as exploring some of the issues covered by the Cop 26 conference.

In PE they have been working on their ball skills and doing basketball dribbling.

### **Stingrays**

Stingrays are using Remembrance to inspire their poetry writing. They are using the trees which are planted at the National Memorial Arboretum to help them think about those who have served and continue to serve their country. The trees planted each have a special meaning linked to remembrance.

They have also been in a reflective mood in RE when they have been thinking about creation and what Christians learn from the creation story.

In their Science this week they discovered more about Alexander Graham Bell and some of the controversy surrounding his inventions.

They have also started to collect headlines they find important to them for their PSHE topic on Rights and Responsibilities.

## Sharks

Although it has been a short week, it's also been a busy one! In preparation for Remembrance Day, Sharks have been learning about the Remembrance Glade at the National Memorial Arboretum and discovered how the different types of tree in the glade inspired poet Laura Mucha to write a remembrance poem; this has provided the inspiration for Sharks' own Remembrance poems.

It is also Parliament Week, so Sharks have been finding out about the role of parliament in running our country, as well as voting for our new PLT representatives to help run our school!

Tuesday was an exciting - and exhausting - return to school with our cross country event. Not only did all the Sharks show impressive *confidence*, *self-belief* and *endurance* during their 6 laps of the field, but there was also a lot of *community*, *citizenship* and *service* as they cheered on their friends across the school, some Sharks even running extra laps alongside younger children who needed extra encouragement!

#### Governor Advert




