## Elaine Patience



Elaine has a unique relationship with a 150yr old violin. It started life in Russia where it was used to teach the Tsar's children by a man called Abraham. During the Russian Revolution, Abraham had to escape with his family and made an incredible 1,000 mile journey by foot. It took them 10 months to travel from St Petersburg to Odesa and from here they went by ship to Leeds in England. Rosa was Abraham's daughter and she played in symphony orchestras across Germany. At the start of World War II, she was arrested and put in a concentration camp. Playing the violin saved her life, as people like to hear music. She managed to entertain her captors by playing in the Auschwitz Orchestra. The violin ended up in an attic for 30 years and came to light on a BBC programme, 'Repair Shop'. Elaine now borrows the violin to play in orchestras and she brings the violin to schools to share the history. Elaine's passion is the violin and she loves how music brings joy to people and spreads positive ripples. Elaine encourages us to enjoy and play music, in any capacity that we can!

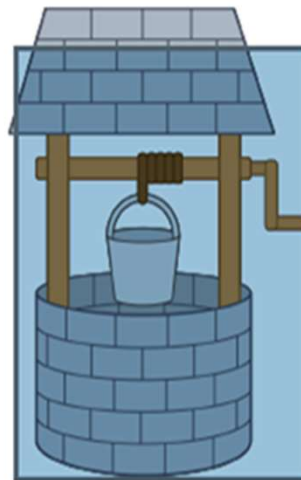
