It has been the most incredible start to the school year! The children have settled into Stingrays wonderfully, showing such kindness, enthusiasm and curiosity in all that they do. They have already begun to live out our school values through the Fritwell Footstep of Curiosity and our Hexagon of Respect and Compassion. We are so proud of their positive attitudes and what active participants they are being in their learning.

In English, the children have amazed us with their creativity and imagination. They began the term by writing their own short sequels to the illustrated book Journey and have since produced fantastic newspaper reports about a flood, linking beautifully to our topic of Water. In Science, we have completed the first half of our topic 'States of Matter', where the children have explored solids, liquids and gases. They have learned how this connects to Geography through the Water Cycle and even carried out a fun melting experiment using chocolate buttons to prove that the higher the temperature, the quicker the solid melts. We are already looking forward to our upcoming trip to Science Oxford after the holidays, where we will continue our scientific explorations even further.

Our Art and Forest School sessions have also been real highlights. In Art, the children have used a range of mediums from watercolours and acrylics to printing and sketching to create beautiful wave-inspired pieces that look like they're moving. At Forest School, they've enjoyed starting fires to boil their water for hot chocolate, using charcoal to paint warrior marks on their cheeks, journalling their nature discoveries, and whittling their own wands. It has been such a lovely term full of growth, creativity and togetherness. What a truly phenomenal start to our year of learning and adventure!

It's been such a pleasure to teach the Sharks this term — they've worked incredibly hard and made an excellent start to the year. I'm already looking forward to what's to come next term!













