It has been a hugely eventful start to the term. Last Saturday we had the annual fireworks show which was a phenomenal success. The event was superbly organised and a sellout once again! On Wednesday I had the pleasure of accompanying Minnows children to Warriner Farm. It was an exciting learning opportunity for the children as they learned about many aspects of the farm including how the animals are looked after. The children asked some really thoughtful questions and behaviour was excellent. A big thank you to Mrs Haselgrove for organising.

This week has been anti-bullying week and we started off with an assembly on Monday introducing the theme. I asked the children about their personal power and the good that can be achieved in using it. The answers showed a depth of understanding the children already have around this subject with the work we already do in school, for example 'stop it I don't like it'. We formally introduced the mend-it ambassadors from Sharks class who are trained to offer support and help to diffuse playground disagreements. As always, I am incredibly impressed with the children's willingness to put themselves forward to make the school an even better place.

The office team have been incredibly busy at the start of this term in migrating all of our management information system data onto a new system called Arbor. This brings us in line with other EPA schools and should make school operations more streamlined. You will learn more about the features for parents very soon.


