Risk Assessment - Fritwell C of E Primary School - 2021

The government continues to manage the risk of serious illness from the spread of the virus. We have moved away from stringent restrictions on everyone's day-to-day lives, towards advising people on how to protect themselves and others, alongside targeted interventions to reduce risk. As COVID-19 becomes a virus that we learn to live with, there is now an imperative to reduce the disruption to children and young people's education - particularly given that the direct clinical risks to children are extremely low, every adult has been offered the opportunity for 2 doses of the vaccine, and all children aged 12 and over are now eligible for vaccination. However, as set out in the autumn and winter plan, the government will remain vigilant and take action where necessary to support and protect the NHS.

Our priority is for you to deliver face-to-face, high-quality education to all pupils. The evidence is clear that being out of education causes significant harm to educational attainment, life chances, mental and physical health.

We have worked closely with the Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC) and UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) to revise this guidance.

This RA is a live working document and will be reviewed weekly. The hazards listed are in no order of importance.

The school will revert to a contingency plan if directed by the Government or UKHSA.

Children will collected by a member of their household after being contacted by a member of the SLT. When a pupil is awaiting collection, they should wait outside if possible and if not then in the medical room. Appropriate PPE should also be used if close contact is necessary. Further information on this can be found in the <u>use of PPE in education, childcare and children's social care settings</u> guidance. The area should be cleaned after pupil has left. The household (including any siblings) should follow the UKHSA <u>stay at home guidance</u> for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection.		

	Asymptomatic testingStaff should undertake twice weekly home tests whenever they are on site until the end of September, when this will be reviewedConfirmatory PCR testsStaff with a positive LFD test result should self-isolate in line with the stay at home guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection. They will also need to get a free PCR test to check if they have COVID-19.		
	 Whilst awaiting the PCR result, the individual should continue to self-isolate. If the PCR test is taken within 2 days of the positive lateral flow test, and is negative, it overrides the self-test LFD test and they can return to school, as long as the individual doesn't have COVID-19 symptoms. Children with symptoms should take a PCR test. Additional information on <u>PCR test kits for schools and further education providers</u> is available. 		
	Admitting children into school A pupil with symptoms should not attend the school, given the potential risk to others. Where symptomatic parents should follow UKSHA guidance. Further support DfE helpline (0800 046 8687, option 1)		
Attendance	School attendance is mandatory for all pupils of compulsory school age Where a child is required to self-isolate or quarantine because of COVID-19 in accordance with relevant legislation or guidance published by UKHSA or the Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC) they should be recorded as code X (not attending in circumstances related to coronavirus).
