Message from Mr Hart

I can't quite believe we are at our mid-term break already. It has been a busy but enjoyable term, with the highlight for me being our upper key stage 2 residential to Kilvrough where the children enjoyed an amazing experience together.

I have also been very happy with the way our lovely new members of school have settled into the unfamiliar routines and rigours of school life.

I must thank our staff for all their effort and hard work on our children's behalf.

When we return to school we will be preparing for Parliament Week (1st to 7th November). We will be formulating our Primary Leadership Team (PLT) and, if they wish to be nominated, I would urge children to prepare a short speech which they could deliver to their class members in the first week back, ready for election.

We have had very productive meetings with our maths, phonics and English advisor this week as we look to enhance provision further for all our children.

Covid

We are all aware that Covid cases have increased and that, in the last few weeks, the school has not been immune either. If your child should fall ill or show any of the symptoms of Covid during half term please do have a PCR test done as soon as possible. Any positive results will incur isolation for 10 days from the date of the test. Please note that no child is to return to school if the result of a PCR test is still awaited.

School emails will be monitored and we would appreciate being advised of any situation which may arise.

Class Activities

Tiddlers & Minnows

This week the Tiddlers and Minnows have mostly been learning about how to keep their bodies healthy. They know that healthy food helps them grow big and strong and gives their bodies energy and that doing regular exercise is good for our brains and our hearts.

In Maths the Minnows have been learning about 2D shapes and the Tiddlers are counting up to 10. The children also had a very exciting morning when they had a visit from a fire engine. They got to sit inside the cab of the fire engine and listen to the siren. The children loved this experience and had a great time learning from the Fire Fighters. They also enjoyed watching the Sticklebacks set their Tudor houses on fire. What a

brilliant way to end the term!

Sticklebacks

What an eventful week has been had in Sticklebacks! The Great Fire of Fritwell was carefully managed by the firefighters and the Stickleback Fire Brigade. How exciting it was for the children to see how quickly the fire took hold, and to watch the real firefighters put it out!

The class has also created some part-whole models to help them with their adding, and made some sundials in Science.



Seahorses

This week the Seahorses have been looking at using base 10 to help the Year 2s add and subtract 10's to 2 digit numbers, and the year 3s have been using base 10 to help them exchange when they add and subtract 2 digit numbers to 3 digit numbers.

In English they have also finished their stories about hunting for food in the Stoneage and have moved on to looking at Cinquain poems. They also began to explore what Hillforts are and how important they were for people in the Iron age.

Stingrays

Stingrays have worked hard in Maths revisiting how to make exchanges when subtracting 3 and 4 digit numbers. They also wrote their own diary entries based on the class book "Coming to England". At the end of the week the children performed their Circus dance based on Victorian style circuses that included ringleaders, acrobats and clown acts.

The Stingrays have now completed their Time Travelling French work by finding out how to say the month and date of birth of some famous French people in History.

Class Activities (continued)

Sharks

In English Sharks have been continuing to reflect on their experience at Kilvrough, writing thank you letters to their instructors which they will be sending after half term. The children have had to show real resilience in Maths as they have been learning written methods of short and long division, drawing upon their developing knowledge of multiplication facts.

After their term training with the Activators, the Sharks Play Leaders have led a practice games session with Seahorses, gaining experience of how to explain the games to younger children and support their play. We look forward to Play Leaders starting games at lunch times after half term.
