It has been a fantastic week in school with the

children working hard on completing their assessments to ensure we can best support their next phase in their learning in the Summer term.

It was brilliant to see so many parents/carers in school at the parents' evenings this week, speaking to the teachers and seeing the super work the children have produced. My thanks go to my staff and families for their time in this valuable aspect of school life.

We were overwhelmed by the support shown for Ukraine on Wednesday and a fantastic £230 was raised for humanitarian aid. The children wrote prayers for Ukraine and these will be displayed along the school entrance fence. Today we saw terrific support for 'Red Nose Day' with children sporting red clothes and telling some great jokes in class. My thanks go to you all for your donations to raise funds for these two important causes.

Class Activities

Tiddlers & Minnows

It has been a very busy week down in Early Years.
The Tiddlers and Minnows started the week with 'Mars Day'
where they were read a story by a real astronaut in space;
the children spoke about what it would be like to be an astronaut
and what they would take with them in their rockets.



The children then continued their science work by planting seeds in the EYFS Nature Area; they all look forward to seeing those seeds grow into plants over the next few weeks.

Tiddlers & Minnows (continued)

The Minnows have been learning about number bonds to 10 in Maths and are getting very good at using objects to find the missing number in their number bond.

The Tiddlers have started their work on patterns by going on a pattern hunt around the classroom and playing a pattern matching card game.





The children also enjoyed a creative afternoon on Wednesday where they made some wonderful transport out of junk modelling. The children have ended the week with a very exciting music lesson where they got to finally use musical instruments to play alongside 'Wheels on the Bus' and 'Old McDonald had a Farm'.

Sticklebacks

This week Sticklebacks had great fun with 'Mars Day' and their dress up days for Ukraine and Comic Relief.

On Monday they carried out a rocket experiment where the children had to observe what happens to a balloon when you let the air out. Their rocket balloon was pushed forwards and they learnt that this is the same as a rocket launching off the ground.

In PE the children set up a circuit of jumping activities and worked hard around the circuit. They felt how fast their hearts were beating and learnt that the heart pumps blood around the body to get oxygen to all their muscles when they exercise.

Seahorses

Year 2s have finished their maths unit on statistics and the Year 3s have finished exploring money.

In English they have been investigating fairytale language and wrote their own version of the introduction to 'Jack and the Beanstalk'.

As part of science week they have also explored optical illustrations and tried to answer the question "Does wild life prefer to live near a tree or far away?"





Class Activities (continued)

Stingrays

Stingrays had another exciting start to the week, with a day focusing on Science activities to celebrate 'Mars Day' and Science week. As well as participating in a live lesson looking at whether there is now, or has been, life on Mars, they also enjoyed investigating the theme of 'Growth'. It was lovely to see them



interacting with children throughout the school as they collected data to help them answer the question 'Do all body parts grow as we get older?'





On Wednesday, they were in a reflective mood as they thought about the children involved in the conflict in Ukraine. The prayers they have written really show our current value of 'Love and Agape', so please take time to read them on the fence leading up to the school.

On Thursday the children had a "sweetastic" afternoon, creating circuits using wine gums, strawberry laces and dolly mixture to represent the components of an electrical circuit. The class labelled and discussed the best sweet to choose. This will help them learn the technical vocabulary they need to create the real things next week.

Friday morning was full of laughter as they discussed Comic Relief and how laughter can help improve their own and other people's mental health.

Class Activities (continued)

Sharks

Mars Day was a great start to the week, packed with Science activities and investigations. Sharks tackled an investigation titled, How to Calculate the Age of a Shark, learning that sharks keep growing throughout their life, so the best way to age a shark is to measure its length. They wanted to find out if the same was true of children, so went around the school measuring the height and finding the age of children in other classes so they could investigate the correlation between height and age. They enjoyed the sense of *Community*, *Citizenship and Service* from getting to work with children in other classes.

Sharks also showed their *Respect and Compassion* and *Love and Agape* on our special day in support of Ukraine when they thought about which of our school values the people of Ukraine were showing and which they may need more support with as they wrote prayers and messages of support.





On top of this, Sharks have shown an excellent attitude towards their assessments this week, using the opportunity to apply their learning from the last term. It has been wonderful to see the children's *Confidence, Self-belief and Endurance* throughout their assessments.

Finally, Sharks are sad to say goodbye to Mr Parsons, who has been working with them for the past nine weeks. They have especially enjoyed his Greek-themed dance and drama lessons, which have certainly caused many *Inspired Minds*. We thank him for all his work and wish him all the best in the future.


Girls Football Match
