Covid Vaccination Update from Oxfordshire County Council

All children aged 5 - 11 will be offered vaccination against COVID-19 from 4 April 2022.

- The Guttmann Centre, Stoke Mandeville

Other child-friendly and convenient vaccination clinics will be open across Oxfordshire over the next week. Appointments will become available on the National Booking Service or by calling 119, so please keep checking if you prefer to go to a clinic closer to home. Locations for these sites will be listed on the Oxfordshire Clinical Commissioning Group website.

Children aged 5-11 with no other underlying health conditions will be offered two paediatric (child) doses of the vaccine, with at least 12 weeks between doses.

Seahorses

America day was a great way to start the week. After the excitement of the plane journey the Seahorses crash landed into a Canadian mountain! They used great resilience to sketch the mountain using a grid to help them to create realistic images. Once they were rescued and taken to the USA, they learnt a dance called waacking. Before long, it was time to go to Brazil for carnival. They got to learn to samba and they made masks that were bright and colourful!



This week the children have also been learning fractions and exploring finding halves, thirds and quarters. We have also been writing a postcard from America, recapping different key grammar terms like 'verb' and 'adjectives'.

Stingrays

Stingrays have had a very thoughtful and creative week. It started with looking at Sikh stories and how they help Sikhs reflect on the teachings of their faith. They made bowls to hold water and jasmine flowers to symbolise that everything in the world is created by God and is there for all to share.







This was followed by working on their music performance to share with the rest of the school to show what they have been learning in music this term. Their performance included singing, playing percussion and glockenspiels.



Their reflections continued as they took part in an outdoor experience to reflect on the Easter Story and help them prepare for the Easter service.

On Wednesday they all settled down to watch a film as their class marble treat for all their hard work over the term - some of them even changed into their pyjamas and brought a teddy.

Sharks

Sharks have been making the most of their learning time, right up to the end of term!

In English, they have been applying all they've learnt about the Greek goddesses to write in role as Prince Paris, judging which goddess deserves the golden apple destined for the fairest. The quality of their writing has been excellent, maintaining a formal tone (including using the subjunctive form) and using conjunctions to guide the reader through their arguments. The class vote agreed with the Greek myth: they chose Aphrodite as the fairest goddess - the event that sparked the Trojan war!

In Maths, Sharks have been consolidating their learning about shapes by calculating missing edges and angles, as well as applying their knowledge of conversions between metric and imperial measures to create line graphs, both by hand and using Excel.

Sharks have also enjoyed finishing sharing their Ancient Greek homework projects. Well done to all the children for such a fantastic range of projects, developing their research, cooking, writing, craft, computing and presentation skills. Thank you to parents for your ongoing support in helping children develop their independence and skills with homework support.
