Message from Mr Hart

Covid Update

Today marks the publication of new guidance about Covid from the government.

- adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature
- children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college, or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and are well enough to attend
- adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be 3 days.

Class Activities

Tiddlers & Minnows

There was a visitor in Minnows and Tiddlers this week... Sporkle the Alien crash landed into the construction area and they have had to help him recover from his ordeal! On Tuesday the children decided to help him with learning numbers and phonics in the

classroom and they began to rebuild a spaceship for him to go back home in. In fact, they contacted NASA for some extra help in sending the right part! They had to do lots of measuring of different types of spaceships so they could let NASA know the height and width of the booster piece he needs.

Minnows have also written sentences and made pictures of our wonderful Earth and then Sporkle is going to tell them a little more about the planet Twink which he comes from.

Lots of new vocabulary has been learnt this week to help them find out more about the Solar System and the parts of a spaceship.

Sticklebacks

This week Sticklebacks had a visitor who delivered a History workshop all about William Morris and his impact on our local area. The children learnt about the history of transport and had the opportunity to handle artefacts from old cars, trains and uses. They learnt how a production line works and they found out that William



Morris gave a huge amount of his money away to school, hospitals and scientific research. They think he was a pretty amazing man!







They also enjoyed sharing with the class their poems that they had learnt at home. Well done to Grace, Elih and Connor for being so confident and sharing your performances with the whole school. You had to show so much confidence and self-belief.









Class Activities (continued)

Seahorses

This week the children have been exploring what plants need to stay healthy and analysing the plants they have been growing in class to see if they are healthy and hypothesise why. They have also been sorting geographical features into human and physical geography and using this to help them design their own American Town.







In addition, they have been rehearsing poems to perform, focusing on how they can use intonation and rhythm to engage the listener.

Stingrays

Thank you to all the Stingray parents who came to their sharing assembly on Tuesday. Hopefully you enjoyed seeing the children brimming with *self belief and confidence* as they shared what they have been learning over the term. They certainly used their *inspired minds* to put the assembly together. As well as working on their speaking skills for the assembly, they also enjoyed sharing their performances of the poems they had been learning both with the class and then with the rest of the school.

Resilience has been the name of the game in English this week as they have been writing, editing and presenting their non-fiction reports about wolves; Mrs Churchill has definitely learnt lots of new facts this week!

In Maths they have been deepening their understanding of what a fraction is and also enjoyed an Active Maths session, focusing on using mental calculation strategies. According to one Stingray ' that was the best Maths lesson ever!'.



Class Activities (continued)

Sharks

In Maths this week, Sharks have been measuring and calculating angles around a point and in a triangle. Using their knowledge of the angles in a triangle adding to 180 degrees, they were able to check the accuracy of their measuring. Using the protractor accurately takes a lot of practice, so Sharks have shown good Confidence, Self-belief and Endurance developing this skill.

In English, Sharks have practised identifying and using different grammar features, including the writing promises made by Greek goddesses using the subjunctive mood to create a formal tone. They also enjoyed performing the poems they had been practising to the class. Well done to Mia, Florian, Evelyn, Rowan and Emilia who were the representatives Sharks chose to perform their poems to the school in our special poetry collective worship on Wednesday afternoon.
